

PRESENT PROVISION: Presently Section 3-2 of the Hawaii County Charter provides that council members are elected for two year terms with no limit on the number of terms that a council member may serve.

PROPOSED AMENDMENT: If approved, the County Charter would be amended to provide that the term of a council member will be limited to four consecutive two year terms or a total of eight years in a row. This amendment does not prevent a member from serving more than four terms as long as the terms are not consecutive.

PRESENT PROVISION: Presently Section 13-1 (f) (9) of the Hawaii County Charter provides that an office is declared vacant if the office holder files to run for another elective office.

PROPOSED AMENDMENT: If approved, the County Charter would be amended to provide that an office would be declared vacant if the elected official ran for another elected office and that term began before the end of the term of the office held. An elected official could run for another elected office, and retain the office, if the term began after the end of the term of the office held.




